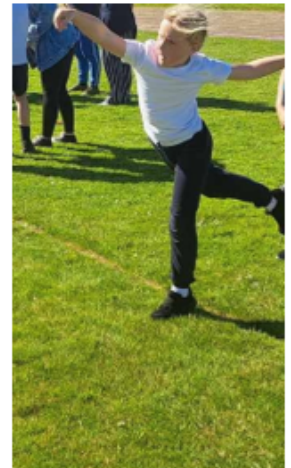


Northwich Town Sports

Via ferrata was a firm favourite! We had to climb across a cliff face 20 feet high, moving our own karabiners along the line as we went.

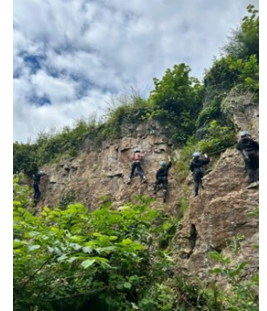
